

A late stoppage time equaliser from Richard Kone earned Wycombe a point as they came from behind against Peterborough United.

Wycombe started poorly in the first half and really lacked any form of control or tempo. Peterborough meanwhile were far more tenacious and took the game to the Chairboys. And it was made all the more easier when Abraham Odoh was running at the Wycombe defence before drawing a foul from Josh Scowen in the Wycombe box. Referee Scott Oldham pointed to the spot to award the Posh a penalty. Malik Mothersile composed himself before placing calmly past Will Norris to give Peterborough the lead. With the Chairboys struggling to get any rythym, they could have been further behind on the stroke of half time when a rather straight forward effort from Peterbough's Hector Kyprianou was spilt by Norris onto the post before he claimed control of the ball. But just before the whistle was called, Norris almost created an equaliser when his quick clearance bounced towards Dan Udoh who was one on one with Peterborough United's goalkeeper Jed Steer. With only placement required, Steer stood strong to deny Udoh and keep the Posh in a winning position at half time.

With Mike Dodds admitting that there was a "few choice words" at half time, we saw a more determined Wycombe side in the second half. And immediately through Richard Kone, the warning signs were there for the Posh. Within the first five minutes of the restart, Kone hit the post. His effort rebounded to Udoh who couldn't respond quick enough before Cameron Humphreys reacted but saw his effort deflected for a corner. From the subsequent corner though, referee controversy continued to dominate as Richard Kone headed home only for Scott Oldham to blow up for a foul on a combination of Peterborough defenders in the build up. Wycombe persevered with the pressure and Kone once again was a threat as a Luke Leahy cross into the box was headed wide by the Ivorian despite being pressured by Posh's Oscar Wallin.

With Peterborough standing firm in the face of the Chairboys attacks, Mike Dodds brought on changes with Fred Onyedinma and Beryly Lubala introduced to add some further goal threat. But Peterborough then had moments to extend the lead. First Ricky Jade-Jones broke on the counter and was one on one with Norris before seemingly jumping away from goal. Despite his protestations, no penalty was awarded. Then with another counter attack, that was seemingly sweeped by Norris then left Caleb Taylor under pressure with a poorly placed pass. But luckily for the Chairboys, The Posh failed to take the initiative to threaten a back peddling Norris. Dodds threw his final roll of the dice by bringing on Tyreq Bakinson and James Berry on to apply some further pressure. And it was a moment from Berry that gained Wycombe the allusive equaliser.

His late run into the box drew a foul from Carl Johnston on the edge of the Peterborough box. Luke Leahy hit the free kick against the wall, but his reactive ball into the box landed to Kone who lashed home a well deserved equaliser. With two minutes left on the clock and Wycombe chasing a winner, Peterborough then had the best chance to win the game. A counter attacking run that was combined between Odoh and Tayo Edun landed at the feet of Ricky Jade-Jones to tap home. But much to the relief of the Chairboys he somehow misplaced his effort wide of the Wycombe net. With the final whistle blown, the result maintained Wycombe in second place in the table. But the promotion race has further intensified as third place Wrexham won against Rotherham and now sets up an incredible narrative ahead of next week's fixture at Adams Park against the Welsh side.
