



# Wycombe Wanderers Website

## Match Report

**The Chairboys claimed their third home win in the last four games at Adams Park as they saw off Burton Albion on Tuesday night, with Dan Udoh displaying efficiency in front of goal to send the Blues ahead, with a mistake from the Brewers doubling Wycombe's lead in the second half.**

It was a strong start for the Chairboys who regained control of the game after Burton had two early chances which were well defended by Will Norris in between the sticks. The hosts looked close to converting on multiple occasions as chances were orchestrated efficiently in the final third. Richard Kone came nearest first in the sixth minute as Dan Udoh set him up nicely from a strike down the centre of the box, but his hit was well saved by Max Crocombe in goal for the Brewers.

Only minutes later, another fantastic chance for the Wanderers was denied by Crocombe in goal. Cameron Humphreys' fantastic footwork allowed for him to weave through a crowd of Burton bodies and down to the byline before he cut back the ball to find Udoh within striking distance. Udoh's close-range effort, however, was directly blocked by the keeper.

The strong partnership up front for the Blues in Kone and Udoh gave the Chairboys the opportunity to claim the opener in the 15<sup>th</sup> minute. Working up from the hosts own half, Kone set up Udoh perfectly on the edge of the box with a tasty ball through the legs of Burton's Anthony Forde. Udoh's hit was well executed a rolled past a diving Crocombe to nestle neatly in the bottom right corner.

Though the Wanderers looked close to doubling their lead through both Luke Leahy and Udoh once again, the half ended with the visitors trailing by one goal to nil.

There were chances for both sides early in the second half, though nothing too much to worry either side. Mason Bennett had an attempt at goal in the 53<sup>rd</sup> minute but his shot was high and wide over the post.

Skipper, Jack Grimmer, came near for the Blues as his right-footed strike from the right edge of the box was just inches away from the target, rattling off the post and out for a goal kick in a quick retaliation to Burton's threat.

It was a massive mistake from Albion that gifted the hosts their second, as Jack Armer rolled the ball past his own keeper in the 59<sup>th</sup> minute to double Wycombe's lead.

The remainder of the half was fairly quiet with neither side converting, allowing for the Chairboys to take the three points and stay positioned in second at the top of the league table.

The Blues now prepare for this weekend's away trip to Peterborough as they look to come home with vital points in the push from promotion.
