Match Report

The Chairboys secured the three points as the chase for the automatic promotion spot continues. Cameron Humphreys composed the only goal of the afternoon to claim the win for the Blues.

The first half was a quiet one for both sides, as neither team were able to convert in the opening 45. The first bit of action came for the Blues as they pushed their way into their attacking box with Cameron Humphreys clipping the ball over to find Xavier Simons situated centrally. Humphreys' pass was intercepted by a Lincoln body and sent out for a corner, allowing for Josh Scowen to send in a strike which shot over the bar and out for a goal kick.

The closest chance of the half came in the 41st minute as Adam Reach attempted to net the ball from an acute angle on the byline which was palmed away by George Wickens in between the sticks for the visitors, but not out to safety as the ball rolled dramatically across the crossbar. Joe Low was able to conjure up a second attempt following a flurry of clearances, but his volley was blocked by a Lincoln body and the threat was nulled.

Despite the pace picking up from the flurry of action, the remainder of the half lacked in any goals and half time saw both sides level on 0-0.

Returning from the break the pace and energy of the game echoed that of the final minutes of the first half, with the visitors getting the opening chance of the half. Erik Ring forced his way down the left wing and into the box, taking a strike at goal, calling Will Norris into action as he batted away the attempt and out to safety, keeping the scoreline level in the 50th minute.

The Chairboys got their breakthrough in the 65th minute as Humphreys edged his way into the box and neatly rounded a sliding Wickens who left the goal open. Humphreys took a few strides before slotting the ball across goal to send the hosts up 1-0.

Caleb Taylor found himself on the end of a huge chance for the Blues as he smashed the ball through the crowd in the box, but Wickens denied the attempt as he swatted the attempt out to safety in the 75th minute.

The visitors went down to 10 men late into injury time as Paudie O'Connor fouled Low, as the Chairboys saw out the remainder of the half and secured the three points thanks to Humphreys' conversion.

The Blues now set their sights on hosting Shrewsbury under the lights at Adams Park on Tuesday 1st April.
