

An evening of few chances at Adams Park saw the Blues exit the Papa Johns Trophy on goal difference after drawing 1-1 with Peterborough United, and then winning the penalty shootout 4-3 for a bonus point, writes Liberty Wilson.

The Chairboys welcomed Brandon Hanlan and D'Mani Mellor back into a much-changed starting XI, while Christie Ward came on late on for his senior debut.

A relatively even first half saw Posh's Ephron Mason-Clark denied by Max Stryjek, while Ronnie Edwards' fierce header was tipped over the crossbar by the keeper's fingertips.

Chris Forino had the first chance for the Blues with a quick back-flick that needed a smart block from the visiting keeper, before a smooth finish from Daryl Horgan straight to the middle of the net made the breakthrough just past the hour-mark.

Posh brought on top scorer Jonson Clarke-Harris and he levelled the scores with eight minutes remaining with a precise header, before the game went to penalties after a 1-1 draw with Peterborough securing their passage to the knockout stages, meaning that Wycombe's 4-3 win in the shootout paled into insignificance.
