Positive update on Tjay De Barr

WYCOMBE Wanderers striker Tjay De Barr has publicly spo-ken for the first time following his medical emergency on December 29. The 22-year-old collapsed sec-

onds after the Chairboys had lost 1-0 away at Plymouth Argyle at Home Park.

He had come on as a 71st-minute substitute for Ali Al-Hamadi in the clash against the Pilgrims, but just moments later, he collided with Argyle's Danny Mayor and was seen holding his chest in discomfort.

Notably, De Barr was spotted on his haunches whilst Wanderers were on the attacking in the latter stages of the game.

Following his collapse, he was stretched off and taken to a nearby hospital in the city for tests but was discharged hours later. De Barr then returned home in

the early hours of December 30. Taking to Twitter on New Year's Eve [December 31], the forward said: "Just wanted to take this time to thank everyone who's been sending me messages and support over the last two days.

"Special thanks to everyone at Wycombe Wanderers, the medical team, all my teammates, staff, and supporters. "I would also like to thank eve-

ryone involved with Plymouth Argyle for their messages of support.

The response from everyone has been very humbling, also thank you to the ref who kept checking on me during the game.

"Luckily I am much better now and all tests came back positive, I'll be back very soon giving 100

per cent like always." De Barr missed Wycombe's next match, away at Peterbor-ough United on New Year's Day, which ended in a 3-0 victory for the Chairboys. Following the medical emer-

gency, assistant manager Richard Dobson said: "Tjay is in good hands and will be taken to hospital to have further tests

'What happened at the end there [against Plymouth], is something that we don't want to see as it caused great concern for everyone involved.

"His wellbeing is the most im-portant thing, and I just want to say that the paramedics from both teams dealt with everything so professionally

They were very quick to aid Tjay and that just highlights how important these people are when these situations do happen."

The next Chairboys fixture after they visit London Road isn't until January 14, when they take on promotion-pushing Sheffield Wednesday.

WYCOMBE Wanderers boss Gareth Ainsworth has praised the performance of goalkeeper Max Stryjek following the Chairboys 3-0 away win at Peterborough United.

The 26-year-old was on hand to deny Ricky Jade-Jones on two occasions, which included preventing the striker from scoring via a one-on-one in the first-half.

He has now kept 10 clean sheets in 24 games for Wycombe since joining the club in August, which includes five in the last eight fixtures.

Speaking on his display at London Road, Ainsworth said: "Max has done so well for us, and for a keeper who joined us a few weeks into the season, he might have got 12 or 13 clean sheets now.

"The one-on-one save he made in the first-half was brilliant and I've not known a keeper to be so good at saving them.

"There are of course some things we would like to work on with him. but that is why we get keepers like him as we want to improve all the players that come through our doors."

Stryjek joined Wycombe in August following the departure of David Stockdale to Sheffield Wednesday on a free transfer.
