So far this summer, Wanderers have secured the signatures of Christie Ward, Jasper Pattenden, Josh Blunkell, and D'Mani Mellor, whilst Jack Young signed a permanent deal from Newcastle Ūnited.

Rumours are ongoing that Nathan Bishop is expected to sign for the club from Manchester United

on a season-long loan.

And after a brilliant opening day victory over Burton Albion, which saw the Chairboys race into a 3-0 lead by minute 30, the boss repeated the notion that squad depth is not an issue, due to players such as Tjay De Barr, Ali Al-Hamadi and Connor Parsons returning from their respective loan spells.

Nick Freeman has also returned to the frame, after missing the last 11 months with an ACL injury

Manager happy after Wycombe victorious over Burton Albion

WYCOMBE Wanderers will spend the opening weekend of the 2022/23 League One season in first place after they defeated Burton Albion 3-0 at Adams Park.
A David Wheeler strike and two

incredible goals from Anis Mehmeti and Josh Scowen gave the Chairboys a healthy lead on the campaign's inaugural Saturday.

Gareth Ainsworth's men had fire in their bellies from as early as the 37th second, as Mehmeti was dragged down by Deji Oshilaja in the penalty box, but Gavin Ward waved away the appeals.

A frustrating start, Wycombe regrouped and took the lead through Wheeler on seven minutes

The utility player was brilliantly put through by a reverse pass from Scowen, and the 32-year-old was on hand to toe-poke his shot underneath Ben Garratt.
Eight minutes later, Wanderers

doubled their advantage as Mehmeti scored what could be one of League One goals of the month already.

After winning the ball of the lefthand side, he weaved in and around four Burton players and smashed the ball beyond a stunned Garratt, in what was the Albanian's first appearance for the club since April.

Burton just could not get going

and despite a few half chances that tamely tested debutant keeper Tyla Dickinson, the half belonged to Wy-

On the half-hour mark, Wanderers scored their third through a bril-

liant strike by Scowen.
A cross from Mehmeti was headed away by the Burton backline, seemingly from danger, but the 28-yearold smashed in a stunning first-time half-volley to make it three.

The goal was his first at Adams Park since returning to the club last season, and his first at the ground since October 2014, a total of 2,842


days ago.

"I said to him that he usually gets one a season and let's see if he can get the biggest tally he has ever got as he's that brilliant holding midfielder that stops everything


"The song about him without the swear word is brilliant as he is, and today, he was in the right place at the right time to get his goal.

The Brewers were dominated by the Chairboys on the season's opening weekend, which saw David Wheeler, Anis Mehmeti and Josh Scowen score before the half-our mark to seal all three points for Gareth Ainsworth's men.

GARETH Ainsworth's could not have asked for a better start to the new season than the 3-0 demolition of Burton Albion, but now comes their first real test with a visit to former Premier League club **Bolton Wanderers**.

That the two clubs now lock horns in the same division tells the remarkable story of their contrasting fortunes over the last decade.

When season 2011/12 got under way, they seemed worlds apart.

Back then, Bolton were a highrespected Premier League club having enjoyed a glori-ous spell under Sam Allardyce when they finished in the top eight in four successive seasons and qualified for Europe.

Wycombe had spent the majority of that period in the bottom division, struggling to make

As Bolton began their 11th consecutive season in the top division with fixtures against Manchester City, Liverpool and Manchester United, the Chairboys faced the less glamorous prospect of opening games against Scunthorpe United, Col-chester United and Leyton Orient in League One.

It was to be a miserable campaign for both clubs, Bolton being relegated from the top-flight and Wycombe suffering the drop back into League Two.

However, while Wycombe began moving up the divisions in the ensuing decade, Bolton went

in the opposite direction and came close to financial disaster.

In the space of just eight years, they fell from the Pre-mier League to League Two and suffered several winding up petitions that threatened the club's future.

As recently as the 2020/21 season, they looked in danger of going out of the EFL altogether when they sat a lowly 17th in the table at the halfway stage. Their form since then has been

truly remarkable, as good as almost any team in the country.

They rose from just above the relegation places to finish third and gain automatic promotion and then began this campaign with an impressive draw at Ipswich, who are highly fancied to win the League One title.

Wycombe have won all four previous meetings without conceding a goal, but this promises to be a much tougher test against a revitalised Bolton team the bookmakers rate as promotion contenders.

Bolton have come a long way in 10 years - but so have Wy-

Boss: 'We won't be paying over the odds'

WYCOMBE Wanderers manager Gareth Ainsworth has reiterated that the club will not pay 'over the odds' for new faces this transfer window.

The Chairboys have so far added four players to their squad at this current moment, with Jasper Pattenden, D'Mani Mellor, Christie Ward and Josh Blunkell all arriving at Adams Park from Worthing, Manchester United, Brockenhurst and Sudbury respectively.

Jack Young has also signed a permanent contract the club from Newcastle United.

from Newcastle United. Rumours on Alfie Mawson's alleged return to Buckinghamshire have gone quiet following his release from Fulham, whilst the club continue to search for a new goalkeeper with Nathan Bishop being the favourite to sign.

However, despite the all the gossip surrounding Wycombe's transfer activity, Ainsworth has restated that players will be signed if change is needed 'for the right reasons'.

Speaking to the press ahead of their trip to Bolton Wanderers on August 6, the 49-year-old said: "It is well documented that we are trying.

"We've tried for a few and have missed out but again, we won't be paying over the odds and ridiculous money for players that we don't think are that worth and that's what we are here.

"We are really pleased with what we have got at this moment.

"I think people love change just because it's change but for me, you need to change for the right reasons, but at the moment, I am pleased with where we are."

As well as the new arrivals, development players in Ali Al-Hamadi, Connor Parsons, Tjay De Barr and all returned to the team following their loan spells last season, and the boss confirmed that they will all 'get a chance' to showcase their talents in the first team.

The trio were in the Wycombe squad for the 5-1 away friendly defeat at Worthing on August 2.

Ainsworth continued: "It was a difficult game.

"The pitch (wasn't great) and four or five players didn't really know the boys well enough as it will take time for them to gel.

will take time for them to gel.
"I am disappointed but obviously it was a trial game with one or two bright sparks, but it's all about the first team games for me and we need to make sure we are competitive in those."

competitive in those."
On the so-called fringe players, the boss added: "I am pretty sure that all of those players will get an opportunity to play in the first team without a doubt.

"The game was tough as we had trialists and you don't know who are you playing with so they didn't know each other's strengths, but with the contracted ones, I can't

see them not playing this season.
"They will all get their chance."

Why the boss wanted to stay at AP

WYCOMBE manager Gareth Ainsworth has revealed that his 'mind was made up' to sign a new contract with the Chairboys after having talks with the club's owners.

The 49-year-old penned a new deal with the Adams Park outfit at the end of June which will keep him in Buckinghamshire until 2025.

He said: "It's no secret that there were rumours with other teams, and without giving anything away, the club backed me, they were interested in me, and for me, my mind was made up that it was good thing to sign my contract extension.

"It's given me a little bit of security and it gives the players a little bit of knowledge that I am committed here, and the vision Rob, Pete and Missy have got here for this club is something I want to buy into.

"They really want to escalate this club into the Championship. We've had a little taste of that, maybe a bit prematurely, but that taste has really wet my appetite and I am desperate to get back up there."

Worthing smash Wanderers side

WYCOMBE Wanderers' development team suffered a heavy 5-1 defeat away at Worthing in a friendly match.

The Chairboys visited the South Coast to face the Non League side on August 2 as part of the Jasper Pattenden deal which saw the youngster move to Adams Park this summer.

Played in front of 729 spectators, the hosts took the lead in the eighth minute thanks to a Mo Jammeh goal, before Ollie Pearce got a second three minutes later.

Ali Al-Hamadi pulled one back for Wycombe before Pearce got his second and Olli White scored on 36 minutes to make it 4-1 at

half-time.

Nodirbek Bobomurodov then made it 5-1 midway through the second-half to round off the win
