

Matt Bloomfield's Chairboys defeated Championship side Watford by three goals to two in a pre-season friendly at Adams Park on Tuesday night.

The Hornets scored first and last but the damage was done during a dominant spell from the hosts, rewarded by goals from Beryly Lubala, Josh Scowen and Richard Kone.

Blues began the game brightly but fell behind when Giorgi Chakvetadze tucked home the Hornet's first chance with a crisp finish into the far corner.

But they deserved their leveller, which came about when Wesley Hoedt went down with an injury but the referee allowed play to continue and Richard Kone laid the ball on a plate for Beryly Lubala to tuck home.

Leahy hit the bar for a third time on 85 minutes before Mileta Rajovic pulled one back with a close-range finish in stoppage time to make it 3-2, but Wanderers closed the game out for an impressive victory.
